

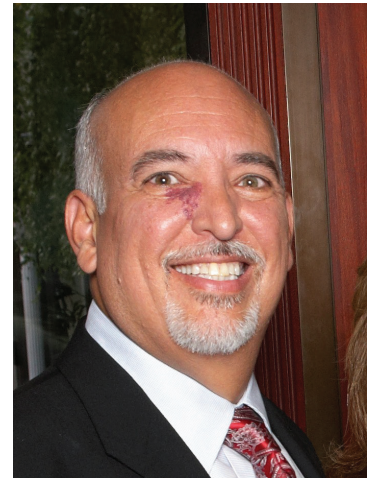


Born in San Juan, Puerto Rico, José M. Dávila migrated to NYC in 1978, to attend Columbia University's prestigious Mailman School of Public Health, where he received a Masters of Public Health/Health Services Administration. He also had previously received Bachelor's and Masters' of Sciences degrees from the University of Puerto Rico. Jose has over 25 years experience in management, particularly in the areas of health services research, health care and facilities, many of which have been tied to the provision of services to persons living with HIV/AIDS.

Jose currently serves as President and Chief Administrative Officer of BOOM!Health, a newly merged and rebranded Bronx-based \$12 million nonprofit agency with a combined staff of 133 comprised of CitiWide Harm Reduction and Bronx AIDS Services. BOOM!Health delivers a full range of prevention, syringe access, harm reduction, health care coordination, behavioral health, housing placement, legal, advocacy and wellness services to over 8,000 individuals in the hardest to reach communities in the Bronx, New York. BOOM!Health strengthens efforts to remove barriers to accessing medical care, with particular emphasis on HIV and viral hepatitis prevention and care services. The vision of the organization is *health, wellness and safety for all* and BOOM!Health is driven by its mission to *transform lives through health and wellness*.

In 2005, he was appointed Bronx AIDS Services' Executive Director as part of a leadership transition plan, after serving for six years as its Chief Operating Officer during which time he creatively administered the physical expansion and modernization of its operations. Prior to becoming BAS' Chief Operating Officer in 1999, he was the Director of Support Services for Promesa (now Acacia Network), one of the largest and oldest minority-run community based organizations in the Bronx, which includes a 108-bed long term care facility for persons living with AIDS.

For 13 years, he served as a senior administrator at Lincoln Medical and Mental Health Center in the Bronx in various capacities. During his tenure as



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as Associate Director for Medical Services, he was responsible for the renovation, outfitting and eventual operation of the hospital's 28-bed AIDS designated unit. For 3 years after leaving HHC, Jose ran his own consulting business, DAMOL Associates, where he provided assistance to Latin American healthcare providers in the acquisition of US made medical equipment and business advice to small medical surgical supply companies in NYC and Puerto Rico.

In addition to his duties at BOOM!Health, he is Treasurer of iHealth, Inc., a statewide association of Care Coordination providers, serves on the Board of Directors of the Latino Commission on AIDS and is a member of the New York State AIDS Advisory Council.

Jose is married to Dr. Maritza Molina, has two children and lives in Westchester County, New York.
